



Afterschool Heals Tennessee

Each year more than 60,000 young kids visit an emergency room because they got into medicines when parents or caregivers were not looking. In 2017, more Tennesseans died from drug overdoses than car crashes.

It is important for parents and caregivers to safely store and dispose prescription medications to prevent accidental consumption among young kids and avoid misuse by Tennesseans of all ages.
